What is the compensation like for home health? Payment for occupational therapists is going to vary greatly depending on experience, the state you ' re working in, and any specialized certifications you might have. The average hourly rate for an OTR working in home health is around \$40 an hour, and for a COTA it is an average of \$30.
